House Bill 7021 – Mental Health and Substance Abuse

Baker Act Reform

- Combines outpatient and inpatient involuntary treatment procedures
- Courts can order outpatient, inpatient, or both as necessary.
- Prohibits placement in state mental health facilities without co-occurring mental illness.
- Witnesses and parties allowed to participate remotely.
- Courts can evaluate patient history and behavior reports.





House Bill 7021 – Mental Health and Substance Abuse

Marchman Act Reform

- Repeals separate provisions for assessments and stabilization; creates consolidated involuntary treatment procedures.
- Enhances accessibility in court proceedings.
- Civil patients no longer require transfer evaluations for mental health treatment facility placement.





House Bill 1365 - Unauthorized Public Camping and Public Sleeping

Civil Action: Residents, business owners, or the Attorney General may sue to prevent counties or municipalities from permitting public camping or sleeping on public property.

Designating Camping Areas: Counties can designate public property for camping or sleeping, with a one-year limit, via a majority vote.

DCF Certification: Requires Department of Children and Families (DCF) approval for such designations, based on:

- > Property not adjacent to residential areas per land use maps.
- > Insufficient shelter beds for the homeless population.
- No significant impact on nearby property values, safety, or security.
- A county plan to maintain the designated property.

Emergency Management

➤ Total Damage Across Three Hurricanes: \$4.8 Billion in assessed damages.

> Breakdown by Hurricane (statewide)

Hurricane Debby: \$232 Million

Hurricane Milton: \$2.7 Billion

Hurricane Helene: \$1.9 Billion

➤ 79,854 Homes Damaged; includes destroyed, majorly damaged, and minorly damaged homes.

Healthcare Innovation Council

- This council was the birth child of past Senate President Kathleen Passidomo and her Live Healthy Initiative
- The council seeks to increase access and improve quality in Florida's health care system by leveraging new technologies and other innovative solutions.
- This council can authorize \$50 million in low interest loans for implementation purposes
